CRIMINAL CONVICTION REVIEW

If you have a criminal conviction and wish to apply for a license, you may make a request to the Board for a determination as to whether your criminal conviction(s) disqualifies you from licensure. Please submit your request along with a completed <u>Criminal Case Form</u> to the Board office for review. Your criminal history will be evaluated based upon the aggravating and mitigating factors outlined in Board Rule <u>4734-6-09</u>.

The Board will notify you if your criminal conviction(s) *disqualifies you from licensure within 30 days of receiving your request. Please note this determination does not prevent you from formally applying for a license. If you should apply for a license and the Board proposes to deny your application, you will be afforded an opportunity for a hearing before the Board, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Chapter 119.

Please note many convictions will not bar an applicant from licensure. You may contact the Board office to inquire if a request and completion of a Criminal Case Form is necessary.

DISQUALIFYING CONVICTIONS FOR LICENSURE

The following offenses disqualify an individual from obtaining a license from the Board: Aggravated murder, kidnapping, rape, sexual battery, gross sexual imposition, aggravated arson, aggravated robbery, aggravated burglary, any offense for which the applicant must register as a sex offender, or a plea of guilty to, or a conviction of, any substantially equivalent criminal offense in another jurisdiction.

(*The Board is not bound by a determination made, if, on further investigation, it is determined that the criminal conviction(s) differs from the information presented in the determination request.)
